

MOUSE AND ROACH ALLERGEN

Helpful tips for mouse and roach allergen avoidance

- **Visual inspection** A visual inspection for signs of mice or roaches is the first step. Look for droppings and possible entryways. If evidence of a mouse or roach problem, pest control should be contacted.
- **Fix entryways** Block all areas where pests or rodents can enter the home. This includes crevices, wall cracks and windows.
- Keep house free of clutter and waste Clean kitchen floors, sinks, counters and stoves. Keep food con tainers and garbage cans sealed and put pet food dishes away after your pets are done eating. Vacuum and sweep the floor after meals, and take out garbage and recyclables. Use lidded garbage containers in the kitchen. Wash dishes immediately after use and clean under stoves, refrigerators or toasters where crumbs can accumulate. Wipe off the stove and other kitchen surfaces and cupboards regularly.
